On Monday, we reviewed our HOMEWORK POLICY to ensure that homework is manageable, purposeful and supports our curriculum. As from next Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March, the following homework will be set:

Homework will be set on a Friday and will be collected in on the following Friday to allow maximum time for completion.

READING AT HOME is really important and we have set a target for the children to read at home AT LEAST three times a week. This can take any form of reading books, comics, newspapers, on-line etc. Reading diaries are monitored on a Friday. From next Monday, 22<sup>nd</sup> March, each child who has read three times at home that week will get a raffle ticket to enter the PRIZE DRAW. Each week, each child will earn a further raffle ticket if they have read at least three times at home. At the end of each term, a winning ticket will be drawn for each class. • THANK YOU to everyone who is working with us to clear any outstanding money owed to the school. We are here to support you and will always want to work with you when things financially are running tight or have got out of control. Please note that the Wrap Around charges for March **have not yet been added** to your account but will be updated next week. Also, please remember that if your child is in YEAR 4 and you are working with us to clear any outstanding monies owed to the school, the debt will need to be cleared by the end of the

summer term. There will be no provision to continue with a payment plan after July 19<sup>th</sup> when your child leaves us. Any money that is still outstanding after this point will have to be referred to our DEBT COLLECTION service. Don't forget, under our new DEBT POLICY, your services may be suspended if you have an outstanding balance with no payment plan in place to clear the debt.

- You will see from the key dates that the Year 1 PHONICS SCREENING TEST and the Year 4 MULTIPLICAION TABLES CHECK dates are getting closer. There are lots of on line resources available for you to use at home to help your child to meet the required standard. If you would like more information about how you can help your child to prepare for these milestone tests, please ask your child's class teacher who will be more than happy to advise you.

For those that have already booked Wraparound Care, there is no need to book into these clubs as they form part of our Wraparound Care. Don't forget - under the new WAC terms and conditions, there will be a charge applied for late bookings.  Please ensure that your child's summer uniform is in line with our uniform guidance on the school website and that all items of uniform and are clearly named - this is the time of year when jumpers and cardigans start to come off and can easily become lost if the item isn't named!

PLEASE REMEMBER that we are a NUT-FREE SCHOOL. Nut products coming into school poses a real risk to the children that we have who suffer from NUT ALLERGIES. Please check that any food sent into school adheres to our NUT-FREE policy.

• PLEASE REMEMBER - If you are considering having your youngster's ears pierced, please consider that this is done in the summer holiday as earrings cannot be removed from newly pierced ears for at least 6 weeks and this will result in them having to miss at least 12 PE lessons. In the same way, in line with our uniform policy, hair must be tied back and no jewellery is permitted with the exception of PLAIN STUD earrings.

## GET INTO SCHOOL ON TIME AND BEAT THE LATE GATE!

Being 5 minutes late every day for a year adds up to the equivalent of 3 days missed.

REMEMBER - Being late can: Cause embarrassment for your child. Make it harder for them to settle. Cause disruption to the class.
